Logistical challenges, including **shortages of key camp staff**, have meant that we would have been unable to deliver the standard of camp experience that you, and we, and the camp, would expect

We can confirm an alternative camp is booked at <u>Tui Ridge</u> for **Monday 13 May - Wednesday 15 May.** Tui Ridge has the benefit of being able to accommodate all five senior classes so all of our year 5 and 6 explorers will attend camp together on these dates.

Thanks to Bicycle Revolution Cambridge for fun ride! The weather was kind and the hot chips as tasty as ever!






The junior Tough Guy and Gal Challenge is on again this year. You can register here.


